Requirements

You do not have to be knowledgable about horses to volunteer at Equest.

You can choose a day and time that best fits your schedule. We ask for a minimum time commitment of about two hours. We can happily accommodate more hours, and/or more opportunities if you wish. Volunteers must be at least 14 years old to work in the riding arena. Volunteers who are at least 12 may help in the barn accompanied by a parent until they are able to demonstrate the willingness and ability to follow directions effectively.

All volunteers working in equine-assisted classes go through orientation and training. You will learn Equest Center policies and procedures and hands-on training in leading, sidewalking, mounting, dismounting, grooming and tacking.

Volunteer opportunities not involving therapeutic riding classes and/or direct care of the horses do not require
